

INSTRUMENT OF GOVERNMENT (VARIATION)

1. The name of the school is St Peter's Church of England (Aided) Junior School.
2. The school is a voluntary aided school.
3. The name of the governing body is "The Governing Body of St Peter's Church of England (Aided) Junior School".
4. The governing body shall consist of:
 - a. Two parent governors
 - b. One local authority governor
 - c. One staff governor
 - d. One headteacher
 - e. One co-opted governor
 - f. Eight foundation governors
5. Total number of governors: Fourteen
6. Seven foundation governors shall be appointed as follows:
 - (a) The Parochial Church Council of the Parish of Farnborough St Peter in the Diocese of Guildford, in the county of Hampshire, shall appoint four governors.
 - (b) The Diocesan Board of Education shall appoint three foundation governors.
7. (a) The holder of the following office shall be a foundation governor ex-officio: The Principal Officiating Minister of the ecclesiastical parish of Farnborough St Peter, in the Diocese of Guildford and in the county of Hampshire.

Reference in this instrument to a principal officiating minister is a reference:

- (i) if the school is for the time being situated in an ecclesiastical parish, to the Rector or Vicar of the parish or, in the case of a team ministry to the Team Rector; or
 - (ii) if the ecclesiastical parish has no Rector or Vicar, to the priest in charge therefore; or
 - (iii) if the school is for the time being situated in a conventional district, to the Curate in charge.
- (b) The Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry within which the school is situated shall be entitled to appoint a foundation governor to act in place of the ex-officio foundation governor whose governorship derives from the office named in (a) above, in the event that the ex-officio foundation governor is

unable or unwilling to act as a foundation governor, or has been removed from office under regulation 21 (1) of the Regulations, or there is a vacancy in the office by virtue of which this governorship exists.

8. The Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry within which the school is situated is entitled to request the removal of any ex-officio foundation governor and to appoint a substitute governor.

9. The school has a Trust which is lodged with Lee Bolton Monier Williams.

10. Ethos Statement:


