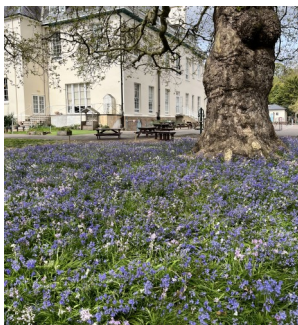
THE SCHOOL BELL

They were able to get up close to tanks large and small from across the decades and even got to sit in a personnel transporter which they really enjoyed. Inside the museum the children saw displays showing the direct impact of the war on Aldershot and Farnborough and had the chance to hold rifles and firearms and wear helmets and officer's caps, and everyone had a go on the assault course. We were also very privileged to hear war stories from some elderly visitors to the museum.
